Did you know.....

that the Theatre Royal Bristol is the oldest continuously working theatre in Britain and has been staging productions since 1766.

It is England's sixth, and the United Kingdom's eighth most populous city, one of England's core cities and the most populous city in South West England

It received a Royal Charter in 1155 and was granted County status in 1373.

The commercial Port of Bristol was originally in the city centre before being moved to the Severn Estuary at Avonmouth.

There are 34 other populated places on Earth named Bristol, mostly in the United States, but also in Peru, Canada, Jamaica and Costa Rica.
