9:30 - 14:00 Wroxeter Roman Ruins - £15

A Guided walk round Wroxeter Roman Ruins, followed by lunch. Wroxeter (or 'Viroconium') was the fourth largest city in Roman Britain. It began as a legionary fortress and later developed into a thriving civilian city, populated by retired soldiers and traders.

Price includes transport, a guided tour with an English Heritage Guide and a two-course buffet lunch.

12:00 - 17:00 Wroxeter Roman Vineyard - £20

A two-course buffet lunch will be served followed by a guided tour of the vineyard and wine tasting. Wroxeter Vineyard

comprises 6 acres set amongst the ruins of the Roman town. Wroxeter is one of two commercial vineyards in the county of Shropshire and since 2004 holds the record for growing the most northerly red wine grapes in the world. Our guide will explain the cultivation, trellising, varieties and the growing aspect of the Vineyards and Olive Groves. We then go back to the winery where vinification from grape pressing to wrapping the wine in glass takes place. Wine tasting and an explanation of English wine takes place in the winery annex. The site is also home to a flock of rare Balwen sheep.

Price includes transport, a two-course buffet lunch, the tour of the vineyard and wine tasting.

which has the extensive remains of an Augustinian abbey including its Abbotts' guarters, refectory and cloisters. The substantially surviving Chapter House has a frontage richly bedecked with 12th and 14th century carving and statuary, and a fine timber roof C1500.

Moving on from here we will go to the Shrewsbury Battlefield site which is roughly where thousands of soldiers died in the 1403 battle. The battle of Shrewsbury was fought between King Henry IV and a rebellious faction headed by the Percy family and marks one of the bloodiest conflicts to take place on British soil. The significance of the battle lies not only in its political ramifications as a precursor to the Wars of the Roses but also in the fact that it was the first time that the English longbow was used on both sides.

After the battle field we visit St Mary Magdalene Church known locally as Battlefield Church. Our guide is Les Hall who is one of the friends of Battlefield Church and has an including its 600 year old carvings.
